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## Getting Started

## Precautions

- Ensure that the AC power supply in your house complies with the identification sticker located on the back of your product.
- Install your product horizontally, on a suitable base (furniture), with enough space around it for ventilation (7.5~10cm).
- Do not place the product on amplifiers or other equipment which may become hot. Make sure the ventilation slots are not covered.
- Do not stack anything on top of the product.
- Before moving the product, ensure the Disc Insert Hole is empty.
- In order to disconnect the product completely from the power supply, remove the AC plug from the wall outlet, especially when left unused for a long period of time.
- During thunderstorms, disconnect the AC plug from the wall outlet. Voltage peaks due to lightning could damage the product.
- Do not expose the product to direct sunlight or other heat sources. This could lead to overheating and malfunction of the product.
- Protect the product from moisture, and excess heat or equipment creating strong magnetic or electric fields (i.e. speakers).
- Disconnect the power cable from the AC supply if the product malfunctions. Your product is not intended for industrial use.

## Disc Types And Disc Format

This product does not support Secure (DRM) Media files.

### CD-R Discs

- Some CD-R discs may not be playable depending on the disc recording device (CD-Recorder or PC) and the condition of the disc.
- Use a 650MB/74 minute CD-R disc.  
Do not use CD-R discs over 700MB/80 minutes as they may not be played back.
- Some CD-RW (Rewritable) media, may not be playable.
- Only CD-Rs that are properly "closed" can be fully played. If the session is closed but the disc is left open, you may not be able to fully play the disc.

## CD-R MP3 Discs

- Only CD-R discs with MP3 files in ISO 9660 or Joliet format can be played.
- MP3 file names should contain no blank spaces or special characters (. / = +).
- Use discs recorded with a compression/decompression data rate greater than 128Kbps.
- Only files with the ".mp3" and ".MP3" extensions can be played.
- Only a consecutively written multisession disc can be played. If there is a blank segment in the Multisession disc, the disc can be played only up to the blank segment.
- If the disc is not closed, it will take longer to begin playback and not all of the recorded files may be played.
- For files encoded in Variable Bit Rate (VBR) format, i.e. files encoded in both low bit rate and high bit rate (e.g., 32Kbps ~ 320Kbps), the sound may skip during playback.
- A maximum of 999 tracks can be played per CD.
- A maximum of 250 folders can be played per CD.

## CD-R JPEG Discs

- Only files with the ".jpg" extensions can be played.
- If the disc is not closed, it will take longer to start playing and not all of the recorded files may be played.
- Only CD-R discs with JPEG files in ISO 9660 or Joliet format can be played.
- JPEG file names should be 8 characters or less in length and contain no blank spaces or special characters (. / = +).
- Only a consecutively written multisession disc can be played. If there is a blank segment in the multisession disc, the disc can be played only up to the blank segment.
- A maximum of 999 images can be stored on a folder.
- When playing a Kodak/Fuji Picture CD, only the JPEG files in the picture folder can be played.
- Picture discs other than Kodak/Fuji Picture CDs may take longer to start playing or may not play at all.

## DVD±R/±RW, CD-R/RW Discs

- Software updates for incompatible formats are not supported.  
(Example : QPEL, GMC, resolution higher than 800 x 600 pixels, etc.)

- If a DVD-R/-RW disc has not been recorded properly in DVD Video format, it will not be playable.

## DivX (Digital internet video express)

DivX® is a video file format developed by DivX, Inc and is based on MPEG4 compression technology to provide audio and video data over the Internet in real-time.

MPEG4 is used for video encoding and MP3 for audio encoding, enabling to watch a movie at near DVD-quality video and audio.

- Aspect Ratio : This product supports up to 720x576 pixels. TV screen resolutions higher than 800 will not be supported.
- When you play a disc whose sampling frequency is higher than 48khz or 320kbps, you may experience shaking on the screen during playback.
- Sections with a high frame rate might not be played while playing a DivX file.
- Since this product only provides encoding formats authorized by DivX Networks, Inc., a DivX file created by the user might not play.

## USB Host Specification

### USB Host Specification

- Supports USB 1.1 or USB 2.0 compliant devices.
- Supports devices connected using the USB A type cable.
- Supports UMS (USB Mass Storage Device) V1.0 compliant devices.
- Supports the device of which the connected drive is formatted in the FAT (FAT, FAT16, FAT32) file system.

### Non-compliance

- Does not support a device that requires installing a separate driver on the PC (Windows).
- Does not support connection to a USB hub.
- A USB device that is connected using the USB extension cable may not be recognized.
- A USB device requiring a separate power source needs to be connected to the product with the separate power connection.

### Operational Limitations

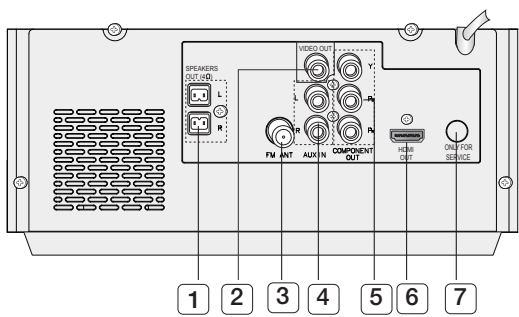

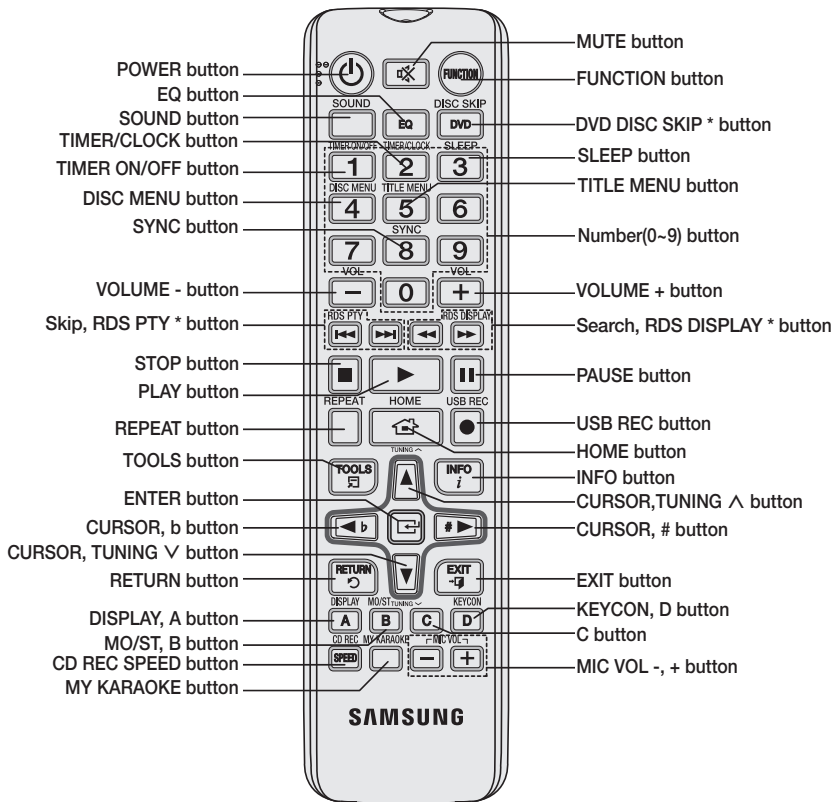
## Rear Panel

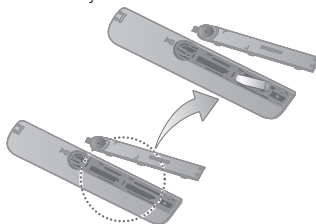

### Installing batteries in the Remote Control

#### NOTE

- Place batteries in the remote control so they match the polarity : (+) to (+) and (-) to (-).
- Always replace both batteries at the same time.

- The remote control can be used up to approximately 23 feet (7 meters) in a straight line.

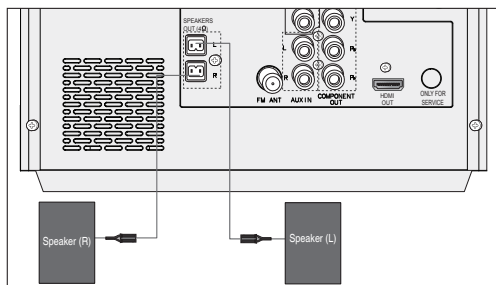

# Connections

Before moving or installing the product, be sure to turn off the power and disconnect the power cord.

## Connecting the Speakers



### Position of the product

Place it on a stand or cabinet shelf, or under the TV stand.

### Selecting the Listening Position

The listening position should be located about 2.5 to 3 times the distance of the TV's screen size away from the TV.

Example : For 32" TV's 6.56 ~ 7.87 feet (2~2.4 m)

For 55" TV's 11.5 ~ 13.1 feet (3.5~4 m)

### Front Speakers **L R**

Place these speakers in front of your listening position, facing inwards (about 45°) toward you.

Place the speakers so that their tweeters will be at the same height as your ear.

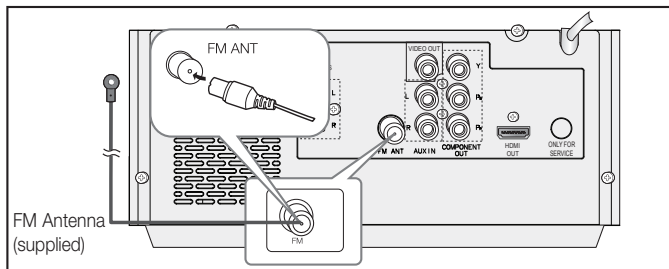
### ! CAUTION

- Do not let children play with or near the speakers. They could get hurt if the speaker falls.
- When connecting the speaker wires to the speakers, make sure that the polarity (+/-) is correct.

### NOTE

- If you place a speaker near your TV set, screen color may be distorted because of the magnetic field generated by the speaker. If this occurs, place the speaker away from your TV set.

## Connecting the FM Antenna

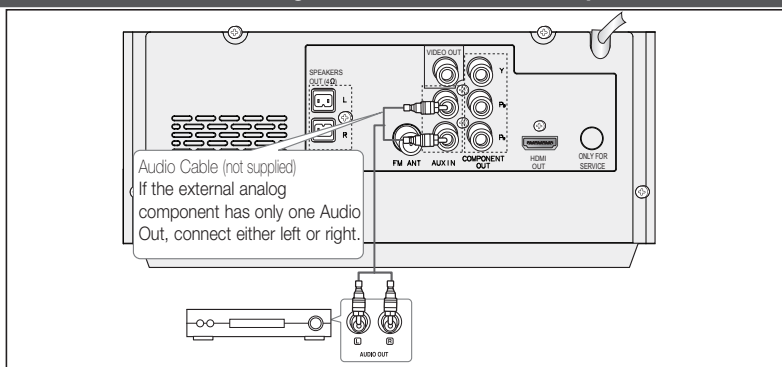


1. Connect the FM antenna (supplied) to the FM Antenna jack.
2. Slowly move the antenna wire around until you find a location where reception is good, then fasten it to a wall or other rigid surface.

### NOTE

- This product does not receive AM broadcasts.

## Connecting Audio from External Components



### AUX : Connecting an External Analog Component

Analog signal components such as a VCR.

1. Connect **AUX IN** (Audio) on the back of the product to the Audio Out of the external Analog component.
  - Be sure to match the colors of the connecting jacks.
2. Press the **FUNCTION** button to select **AUX** input.
  - The mode switches as follows :  
**DVD/CD → ARC → FM → USB → R.IPOD → IPOD → AUX → BT/GAL.**



#### NOTE

- You can connect the Video Output jack of your VCR to the TV, and connect the Audio Output jacks of the VCR to this product.

## Connecting the Microphone

You can enjoy the feeling of a karaoke bar in the comfort of your home.

Watch the video and sing along the lyrics displayed on the TV screen against the accompaniment.

1. Connect the microphone to the MIC jack on the front of the product.
2. Press the **MIC VOL-**, + button to adjust the volume of the microphone.
3. During the playback, press the **KEYCON** button, then press the **(#/b)** button.  
 Each time the **(#)** button is pressed, the key is increased, and each time the **(b)** button is pressed, the key is decreased.
4. Press the **MY KARAOKE** button to suppress the Vocal. Each time the button is pressed, the selection is changed as follows: **MIN → MAX → OFF.**



#### NOTE

- If you hear strange noises (squealing or howling) while using the Karaoke feature, move the microphone away from the speakers. Turning down the microphone's volume or the speaker volume is also effective.
- The microphone does not operate in the AUX and TUNER mode.
- After setting my karaoke or the keycon, EQ/POWER BASS does not work.
- MY KARAOKE function doesn't work in DIVX state, KEYCON function doesn't work in DIVX/USB/MP3/WMA state.
- When Speaker Selection is set to TV Speaker, The Microphone is not available.
- After the stop operation, the setting of my karaoke and keycon will disappear.
- Only when connected with a Microphone, the MY KARAOKE and KEYCON functions are available.

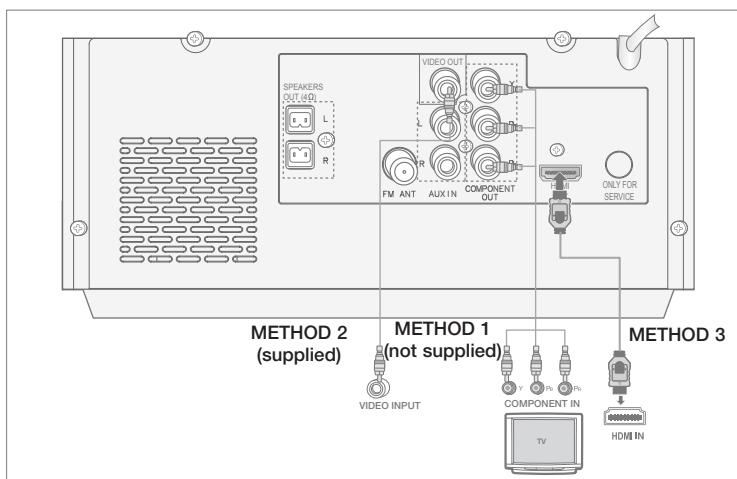

# Connections

## Connecting the Video Out to your TV

Choose one method for connecting to a TV.



### METHOD 1 : Component Video(BETTER QUALITY)

If your television is equipped with Component Video inputs, connect a Component video cable (not supplied) from the **COMPONENT OUT** (Pr, Pb and Y) Jacks on the back of the product to the Component Video Input Jacks on your TV.

### METHOD 2 : Composite Video(GOOD QUALITY)

Connect the supplied Video cable from the **VIDEO OUT** jack on the back of the product to the VIDEO IN jack on your TV.

### METHOD 3 : HDMI(BEST QUALITY)

Connect an HDMI cable (not supplied) from the **HDMI OUT** jack on the back of the product to the HDMI IN jack on your TV.

#### NOTE

- Resolutions available for the HDMI output are 480p(576p), 720p,1080i/1080p. See page 17 for the resolution setting.
  - This product operates in Interlace scan mode 480i(576i) for component/composite output.
  - After making the video connection, set the Video input source on your TV to match the corresponding Video output mode on your product.
- Turn this product on first before you set the video input source on your TV. See your TV owner's manual for more information on how to select the TV's Video Input source.

## ! CAUTION

- Do not connect the unit through a VCR. Video signals fed through VCRs may be affected by copyright protection systems and the picture will be distorted on the television.

## HDMI FUNCTION

### HDMI Auto Detection Function

If your TV is Samsung TV and it supports CEC function. The product's video output will automatically change to HDMI mode when connecting an HDMI cable while power is on.



- HDMI (High Definition Multimedia Interface)
- HDMI is an interface that enables the digital transmission of video and audio data with just a single connector. Using HDMI, the product transmits a digital video and audio signal and displays a vivid picture on a TV having an HDMI input jack.
- HDMI connection description
  - HDMI outputs only a pure digital signal to the TV.
  - If your TV does not support HDCP (High-bandwidth Digital Content Protection), random noise appears on the screen.
- What is the HDCP?
- HDCP (High-band width Digital Content Protection) is a system for protecting DVD content outputted via HDMI from being copied. It provides a secure digital link between a video source (PC, DVD, etc) and a display device (TV, projector, etc). Content is encrypted at the source device to prevent unauthorized copies from being made.

### Using Anynet+(HDMI-CEC)

Anynet+ is a function that enables you to control other Samsung Devices with your Samsung TV's remote control. Anynet+ can be used by connecting this product to a SAMSUNG TV using a HDMI Cable. This is only available with SAMSUNG TV's that support Anynet+.


1. Connect the the product to a Samsung TV with an HDMI cable. (See page 14)
2. Set the Anynet+ function on your TV. (See the TV instruction manual for more information.)

## NOTE

- The Anynet+ function supports some buttons of the remote control.
- This function is not available if an HDMI cable does not support CEC.
- Depending on your TV, certain HDMI output resolutions may not work. Please refer to the user's manual of your TV.
- Please check the  logo (If your TV has an  logo, then it supports Anynet+ function.)

### Using ARC(Audio Return Channel)

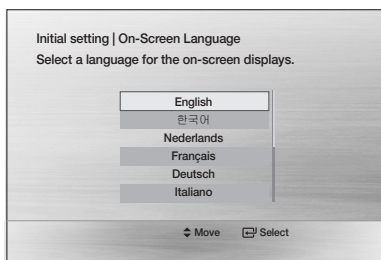
ARC is feature that transfer audio from the TV back to the product and listen to your TV's audio through the product instead of the TV's speakers without having to connect a second cable between the TV and other audio system.

1. Connect the the product to a Samsung TV with an HDMI cable. (See page 14)
2. Press the **F** () button to select ARC input.
  - You can select ARC by pressing the FUNCTION button on the remote control and the product.

# Setup

## Before Starting (Initial Setting)

1. Press the **POWER** button when it is plugged in TV for the first time.  
Initial Setting screen will be displayed.



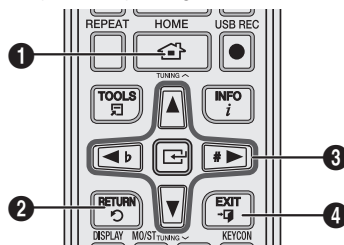
2. Press the **▲▼** buttons to select the desired language, then press the **ENTER** button.
3. Press the **▲▼** buttons to select desired TV Aspect, then press the **ENTER** button.

### NOTE

- To move to the previous screen, press and hold the **RED(A)** button.
- Once you selected a menu language, you can change it by pressing the **STOP (■)** button on the front panel for more than 5 seconds with no disc inserted.
- When the Initial Setting screen does not appear, refer to Initial Setting. (see page 19)

## Setting the Setup menu

The access step may differ depending on the selected menu. The GUI (Graphical User Interface) in this manual may differ, depending on the firmware version.



**1 HOME BUTTON** : Display the home menu.

**2 RETURN BUTTON** : Return to the previous setup menu.

**ENTER / DIRECTION BUTTON**  
Move the cursor and select an item.  
Select the currently selected item.  
Confirm the setting.

**4 EXIT BUTTON** : Exit the setup menu.



1. In NO DISC mode, or during playback, press **STOP** button twice.
2. Press the **◀▶** buttons to select **Settings**, then press the **ENTER** button.
3. Press the **▲▼** buttons to select desired menu, then press the **ENTER** button.
4. Press the **▲▼** buttons to select desired sub-menu, then press the **ENTER** button.
5. Press the **▲▼** buttons to select desired item, then press the **ENTER** button.
6. Press the **EXIT** button to exit the setup menu.






## Display

You can configure various display options such as the TV Aspect.

### TV Aspect

Depending on the type of television you have, you may want to adjust the screen setting.

• 4:3 Pan-Scan	
	Select when you want to see the 16:9 video supplied by the DVD without the black bars on top and bottom, even though you have a TV with a 4:3 ratio screen(extreme left and right portion of the movie picture will be cut off).
• 4:3 Letter Box	
	Select when you want to see the total 16:9 ratio screen DVD supplies, even though you have a TV with a 4:3 ratio screen. Black bars will appear at the top and bottom of the screen.
• 16:9 Wide	
	You can view the full 16:9 picture on your widescreen TV.

#### NOTE

- If a DVD is in the 4:3 ratio, you cannot view it in the wide screen.
- Since DVD discs are recorded in various image formats, they will look different depending on the software, the type of TV, and the TV aspect ratio setting.
- When using HDMI, the screen is automatically converted to the 16:9 Wide mode and TV Aspect is deactivated.

### BD Wise

(Samsung products only)

BD Wise is Samsung's latest inter-connectivity feature. When you connect Samsung products with BD-Wise to each other via HDMI, the optimum resolution will be set automatically.

- **On** : The original resolution of the DVD disc will be output to the TV direct.
- **Off** : The output resolution will be fixed according to the Resolution previously set, regardless of the resolution of the disc.

#### NOTE

- This will optimize the picture quality according to the content (In the DVD disc, etc) that you want to play and the product or your BD Wise-compliant Samsung TV.
- If you want to change the resolution in BD Wise mode, you must set BD mode to Off in advance.
- BD Wise will be disabled if the product is connected to a device that does not support BD Wise.

### Resolution

Sets the output resolution of the HDMI video signal. The number in 480p(576p), 720p, 1080i and 1080p indicates the number of lines of video.

The i and p indicate interlace and progressive scan, respectively.

- **480p(576p)** : Outputs 480 lines of progressive video.
- **720p** : Outputs 720 lines of progressive video.
- **1080i** : Outputs 1080 lines of interlaced video.
- **1080p** : Outputs 1080 lines of progressive video.
- **BD Wise** : Automatically sets the optimal resolution when connected via HDMI to a TV with the BD Wise feature. (The BD Wise menu item appears only if BD Wise is set to On.)

- If Component or Composite is connected, the resolution supports only 480i(576i).
- 1080P may not appear depending on TV.

### Video Out Signal

Different countries apply different TV standard. You can select from NTSC or PAL.

- **NTSC** : You can set to the NTSC video format
- **PAL** : You can set to the PAL video format

#### NOTE

- Depending on the type(NTSC or PAL) of main unit you have, the TV screen displayed may be different.

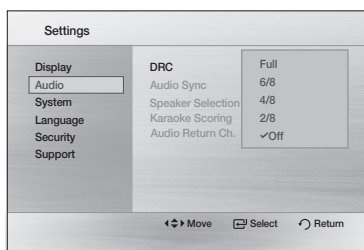
You can optimize the color setting from the HDMI output. Select a connected device Type.

- **Monitor** : Select if connected to a Monitor via HDMI.
- **TV** : Select if connected to a TV via HDMI.

### Audio

## DRC (Dynamic Range Compression)

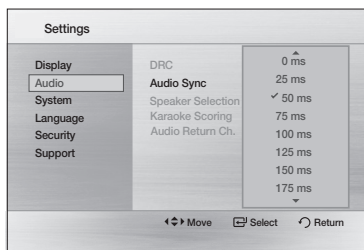
This feature balances the range between the loudest and quietest sounds. You can use this function to enjoy Dolby Digital sound when watching movies at low volume at night.



- You can select either Full, 6/8, 4/8, 2/8, Off.

## AUDIO-SYNC

Video and audio sync may not match with digital TV. If this occurs, adjust the audio delay time to match the video.



- You can set the audio delay time between 0 mS and 300 mS. Set it to the optimal status.

## Speaker Selection

The audio signals transmitted over the HDMI Cable can be changed Audio System/TV Speaker.

- **Audio System** : Video is transmitted over the HDMI connection cable only, and audio is output through the product speakers only.
- **TV Speaker** : Both video and audio signals are transmitted over the HDMI connection cable, and audio is output through your TV speakers only.

### NOTE

- The default setting of this function is Audio System .
- HDMI Audio is automatically down-mixed to 2ch for TV speakers.
- When TV Selection is set to TV Speaker, EQ/ POWER BASS doesn't work.
- With Speaker Selection set to 'TV Speaker', the volume can be adjusted only using the TV remote control.

## Karaoke Scoring

Karaoke score display can be toggled On or Off.

- **Off** : Turns off the karaoke score display.
- **On** : After the singing, the score is displayed on the screen.

### NOTE

- In USB/DIVX/MP3/WMA state, karaoke scoring does not work.

## Audio Return Ch.

You can enjoy TV sound from the speakers by using just one HDMI cable.

- **Off** : Turn the Audio Return Channel function off.
- **Auto**: Listen to TV sound from the speakers if your TV is compatible with the Audio Return Channel function.

### NOTE

- When Anynet+ (HDMI-CEC) is Off, the Audio Return Channel function is not available.

#### NOTE

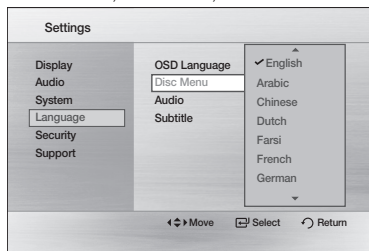

- Even after you reset the system, the settings of DivX Registration will not be reset.

### DivX(R) Deactivation

Select this to get a new registration code.

## Language

You can select the language you prefer for on-screen menu, disc menu, etc.



OSD Language	Select the language for the on-screen displays.
Disc Menu	Select the language for the disc menu displays.
Audio	Select the language for disc audio.
Subtitle	Select the language for disc subtitles.

※ To select another language, select OTHERS of Disc Menu, Audio and Subtitle, and enter the language code of your country (see page 36).

## Security

The Parental Lock function works in conjunction with DVDs that have been assigned a rating which helps you control the types of DVDs that your family watches. There are up to 8 rating levels on a disc.

### Parental Rating

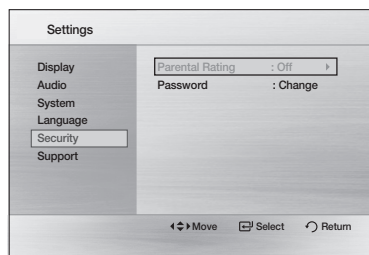
Select the rating level you want to set. A larger number indicates that the program is intended for adult use only. For example, if you select up to Level 6, discs that contain Level 7, 8 will not play.

Enter the password and then press the **ENTER** button.

- The password is set to "0000" by default.
- Once the setup is complete, you will be taken to the previous screen.

### Change Password

Select **Change** and enter the 4-digit password to set the parental lock using the number buttons on the remote control.



### If you forgot your password

## Disc Playback

1. Press the **OPEN/CLOSE** button.

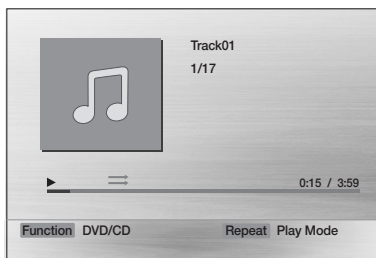
### NOTE


- Resume function: When you stop disc play, the product remembers where you stopped, so when you press **PLAY** button again, it will pick up where you left off. (This function works only with DVDs.) Press the **STOP** button twice during playback to disable the Resume function.
- If no buttons are pressed on the product or remote control for more than 3 minutes when the product is in Pause mode, it will be changed to Resume stop mode. and after another 5 minutes in Resume stop mode, it will be changed to screen saver mode.
- The initial screen may appear different, depending on the content of the disc.
- Pirated discs will not run in this product because it violates the CSS (Content Scrambling System : a copy protection system) recommendations.
- DTS Audio is not supported.
- ※  will appear when an invalid button is pressed.

## TV Screen Saver/Power Saving Function

- If no button input is made for more than 5 minutes in Stop or Play (music) mode, the screen saver will be activated.
- If the product is left in the screen saver mode for more than 20 minutes, the power will automatically turn off. (Except during play a music)

## Audio CD(CD-DA)/MP3/WMA Playback

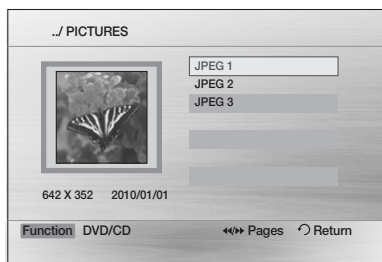

## Rotate Function

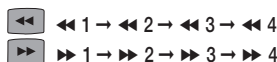

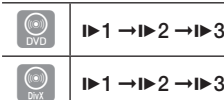

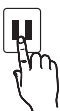

## A-B Repeat Playback

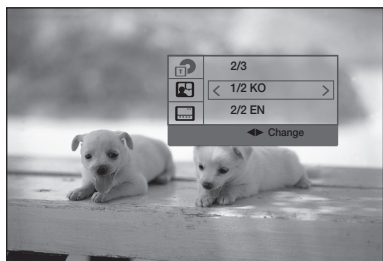
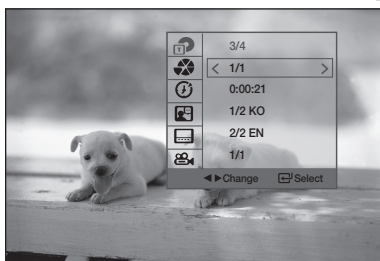

## Displaying Disc Information









1. During the playback, press the **TOOLS** button on the remote control.
2. Press the **▲▼** buttons to select the desired item.
3. Press the **◀▶** buttons to make the desired setup change and then press the **ENTER** button.
  - You may use the number buttons of the remote control to control some item.
4. To make Disc information disappear, press the **TOOLS** button again.

### NOTE

- If you are playing contents from the tools menu, some functions may not be enabled depending on the disc.
- Some tools menu may differ depending on discs and files.


## TOOLS menu

- **Title**(): To access the desired title when there is more than one in the disc. For example, if there is more than one movie on a DVD, each movie will be identified as a Title.

- **Chapter**(): Most DVD discs are recorded in chapters so that you can quickly find a specific chapter.
- **Playing time**(): Allows playback of the film from a desired time. You must enter the starting time as a reference. The time search function does not operate on some discs.
- **Audio**(): Refers to the film's soundtrack language. A DVD Disc can contain up to 8 audio languages.
- **Subtitle**(): Refers to the subtitle languages available in the disc. You will be able to choose the subtitle languages or, if you prefer, turn them off from the screen. A DVD Disc can contain up to 32 subtitle languages.
- **Angle**(): When a DVD contains multiple angles of a particular scene, you can use the Angle function.

## Selecting the Audio Language



1. Press the **TOOLS** button.
2. Press the **▲▼** buttons to select **AUDIO** ( display).
3. Press the **◀▶** buttons to select the desired audio language.
  - Depending on the number of languages on a DVD disc, a different audio language is selected each time the button is pressed.





## Selecting the Subtitle Language



1. Press the **TOOLS** button.
2. Press the **▲▼** buttons to select **SUBTITLE** ( ) display.
3. Press the **◀▶** buttons to select the desired subtitle language.
  - Depending on the number of languages on a DVD disc, a different subtitle language is selected each time the button is pressed.



### NOTE

- Depending on the disc, the Subtitle and Audio Language functions may not be available.
- On the DivX file format, the subtitle languages may be represented by only numbers.

## Angle Function



This function allows you to view the same scene in different angles.

1. Press the **TOOLS** button.
2. Press the **▲▼** buttons to select **ANGLE** ( ) display.
3. Press the **◀▶** buttons to select the desired angle.



### NOTE

- The Angle function works only with discs on which multiple angles have been recorded.

## Caption Function



- You must have some experience with video extraction and editing in order to use this feature properly.
- To use the caption function, save the caption file (\*.smi) in the same file name as that of the DivX media file (\*.avi) within the same folder.  
Example. Root Samsung\_007CD1.avi  
Samsung\_007CD1.smi
- Up to 60 alphanumeric characters or 30 East Asian characters (2 byte characters such as Korean and Chinese) for the file name.
- The subtitle of DivX files are \*.smi, \*.sub, \*.srt over 148 kbyte is not supported.

# Basic Functions

## Sound Mode

### EQ

Your micro-compact system is equipped with a preset equalizer that allows you to choose the most appropriate balance between treble and bass frequencies, according to the type of music you are listening to.

Press **EQ** on the remote control. Each time you press EQ, the EQ model will switch in the following order:

OFF → FLAT → RANCHA → SAMBA → CUMBIA → HABANA → BOOMBA → REGGAE → PARTY → POP → HIPHOP → ROCK → JAZZ → CLASS → STA+EQ → DYN+S → MP3+ → VIR+S.

#### NOTE

- The equalizer is set to "OFF" automatically and becomes not available during a CD recording.
- This function is not available during playback of a DVD disc.

## POWER BASS

Your micro-compact system has a bass amplification function called Power Bass. This function makes the sound more powerful and real.

1. Press the **SOUND** button on the remote control.  
Result: "POWER BASS ON" is displayed.
2. To cancel this function, press this button again, "POWER BASS OFF" is displayed for a few seconds.

#### NOTE

- The Power Bass is set to "OFF" automatically and becomes not available during a CD recording.

## Mute Function

This is useful when answering a doorbell or telephone call.

1. Press **MUTE** button:
  - 'MUTE' appears in the display.
  - To switch the sound back on, press the **MUTE** button again or the **VOL-**, **+** button.



## Display Function

You can view all functions available on the display, adjust the brightness of the display.

1. Each time you press the **DISPLAY** button on the remote control, the display mode will change as following:
  - **The Demo function**  
All functions available on the system appear on the front panel display.
  - **The Dimmer function**  
The Dimmer function is selected and the display darkens.
  - **Display ON**  
The Display turns on.
  - **Clock ON**  
The Clock you set is displayed.

## Listening to Radio

### Using buttons on the Remote Control

1. Press the **FUNCTION** button to select **FM**.
2. Tune in to the desired station.
  - **Preset Tuning** : Press the **STOP** button to select **FMXX** and then press **TUNING**  $\wedge$ ,  $\vee$  buttons to select the preset station.
  - **Automatic Tuning** : Press the **STOP** button to select **MANUAL** and then press and hold the **TUNING**  $\wedge$ ,  $\vee$  button to automatically search for active broadcasting stations.
  - **Manual Tuning** : Press the **STOP** button to select **MANUAL** and then briefly press the **TUNING**  $\wedge$ ,  $\vee$  button to increase or decrease the frequency.

### Using buttons on the product

1. Press the **F** button to select **FM**.
2. Select a broadcast station.
  - **Preset Tuning** : Press the **STOP** (■) button to select **FMXX** and then press the **◀◀ ▶▶** buttons to select the preset station.
  - **Automatic Tuning** : Press the **STOP** (■) button to select **MANUAL** and then press and hold the **◀◀ ▶▶** buttons to automatically search the band.
  - **Manual Tuning** : Press the **STOP** (■) button to select **MANUAL** and then press the **◀◀ ▶▶** buttons to tune in to a lower or higher frequency.

## Setting Mono/Stereo

Press the **MO/ST** button.

- Each time the button is pressed, the sound switches between **STEREO** and **MONO**.
- In a poor reception area, select **MONO** for a clear, interference-free broadcast.



### NOTE

- This applies only when listening to an FM station.

## Presetting Stations

Example : Presetting FM 89.10 in the memory

1. Press the **FUNCTION** button to select **FM**.
2. Press the **STOP** (■) button on the top panel to select <MANUAL> mode.
3. Press the **◀◀ ▶▶** button on the top panel to select <89.10>.
4. Press the **ENTER** button.
  - Number flashes on the display.
5. Press the **◀◀ ▶▶** buttons on the top panel to select preset number.
  - You can select between 1 and 15 presets.
6. Press the **ENTER** button again.
  - Press the **ENTER** button before number disappears from the display.
  - Number disappears from the display and the station is stored in memory.
7. To preset another station, repeat steps 2 to 6.
  - To tune to a preset station, press the **◀◀ ▶▶** on the top panel to select a channel.

### NOTE

- You can also use **TUNING**  $\wedge$ ,  $\vee$  buttons on the remote control instead of **◀◀** or **▶▶** buttons in step 3,5,7.

# Basic Functions

## Setting the Clock

For each step, you have a few seconds to set the required options. If you exceed this time, you must start again.

1. Switch the system on by pressing the **POWER** button.

2. Press and hold **TIMER/CLOCK** button and then press the **ENTER** button.



Result: "CLOCK" is displayed.

3. Press **ENTER**.

Result: The hour flashes.

- Increase the hours: ▲
- Decrease the hours: ▼

4. When the correct hour is displayed, press **ENTER**.

Result: The minutes flashes.

- Increase the minutes: ▲
- Decrease the minutes: ▼

5. When the correct minute is displayed, press **ENTER**.

Result: "⏰ TIMER" appears in the display.

- The current time is now set.

### NOTE

- You can display the time, even when you are using another function, by pressing and hold the **TIMER/CLOCK** button once.
- You can also use ◀◀ or ▶▶ on the front panel instead of ▲, ▼ buttons in step 3,4.

## Timer Function

The timer enables you to switch the system on or off at specific times automatically.

- Before setting the timer, check that the current time is correct.
- For each step, you have a few seconds to set the required options. If you exceed this time, you must start again.
- If you no longer want the system to switch on or off automatically, you must cancel the timer by pressing the **TIMER ON/OFF** button.

Example: You wish to wake up to music every morning.

1. Switch the system on by pressing the **POWER** button.



2. Press and hold the **TIMER/CLOCK** button and then press ▲ or ▼ buttons until ⏰ **TIMER** is displayed.

3. Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: **ON** is displayed for a few seconds, you can set the timer switch-on time.

4. Set the timer switch-on time.

- a Press the ▲ or ▼ button.
- b Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: The minutes flash.

- c Press the ▲ or ▼ button.
- d Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: **OFF** is displayed for a few seconds, you can now set the timer switch-off time.

5. Set the timer switch-off time.

- a Press the ▲ or ▼ button.
- b Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: The minutes flash.

- c Press the ▲ or ▼ button.
- d Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: **VOL XX** is displayed, where **XX** corresponds to the volume already set.

6. Press ▲ or ▼ button to adjust the volume level and press the **ENTER** button.

Result: The source to be selected is displayed.

7. Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the desired source to be played when the system switches on.

- **FM (radio) :** a Press the **ENTER** button.  
b Select a preset station by press the ▲ or ▼ button.
- **DVD/CD (compact disc):** Load one audio CD.
- **USB :** Connect the USB device.

## Sleep Timer Function

You can set the time that the DVD player will shut itself off.

- Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: CHK REC (Do you want to record?) is displayed.

- Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: REC N is displayed, you can press the **▲** or **▼** button to select the REC Y or REC N, and then press ENTER button.

- If you select the REC N, it will cancel tuner timing recording even if you have already set the tuner timing recording.
- If you select the REC Y, you can set the tuner timing recording.
  - Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: ON is displayed for a few seconds, you can set the tuner timing recording switch-on time.

- Press the **ENTER** button.

Result: OFF is displayed for a few seconds, you can set the tuner timing recording switch-off time.

- Press and hold **SLEEP** button:

- Result: Starts playback and the following indication appears: **90 MIN**

**SLEEP**

- Press and hold the **SLEEP** button once or more times to indicate how long the system should continue playing before it switches off:

90 MIN → 60 MIN → 45 MIN → 30 MIN →  
15 MIN → OFF

At any time, you can:

- check the remaining time by pressing and holding the **SLEEP** button.
- Change the remaining time by repeating steps 1 and 2.

- To cancel the sleep timer, press and hold the **SLEEP** button until **OFF** appears on the display.



### NOTE

- The maximal tuner timing recording time is 5 hours.
- If the timer switch on and off times are identical, the word **ERROR** is displayed.
- If there is no disc or usb, please wait 5 seconds, it will automatically change to "FM".
- If the switch-on or -off time is the same as the timing recording time, only the switch-on or -off time is effective, and the timing recording time is not applied.
- If the auto timer is turned on, the DVD/CD or USB function may require an additional step to be activated depending on the disc (or device). Hence it is better for you to select the FM function instead.


## Cancelling the Timer

After having set the timer, it will start automatically as shown by the **TIMER** indication on the display. If you no longer wish to use the timer, you can cancel it.

**TIMER ON/OFF**



- To cancel the timer, press and hold the **TIMER ON/OFF** button once.

Result:  is no longer displayed.

- To resume the timer, press and hold the **TIMER ON/OFF** button again.

Result:  is displayed again.

### NOTE

- When you select the **TIMER OFF** mode, the **TIMER RECORDING** and **TIMER** function are not available.

# Advanced Functions

## Using Bluetooth

You can use a Bluetooth device to enjoy music with high quality stereo sound, all without wires!

### What is Bluetooth?

Bluetooth is a technology that enables Bluetooth-compliant devices to easily interconnect with each other using a short wireless connection.

- A Bluetooth device may involve with a noise or malfunction, depending on usage.
- When a part of human body is in contact with the receiving/transmitting system of the Bluetooth device or the Product.
- Electrical variation from obstructions caused by a wall, corner or office partitioning.
- Electrical interference from same frequency-band devices including medical equipment, microwave oven and wireless LAN.
- Pair the Product with the Bluetooth device while keeping a close distance.
- The farther the distance between Product and Bluetooth device is, the worse the quality is. If the distance exceeds the Bluetooth operational range, the connection is lost.
- In poor reception-sensitivity areas, the Bluetooth connection may not work properly.
- This wireless device may cause an electric interference during its operation.
- The Product has an effective reception range of up to 10 meters in all directions if there are no obstacles. The connection will be automatically cut off if the distance is out of this range. Even within this range, the sound quality may be deteriorated by obstacles such as walls or doors.

### To connect the product to a Bluetooth device

Check if the Bluetooth device supports the Bluetooth-compliant stereo headset function.

1. Press the **FUNCTION** button on the remote control of product to display the "BT/GAL" message.
  - You will see "WAIT" for 2 seconds and then "READY" display .
2. Select the Bluetooth menu on Bluetooth device you want to connect. (refer to Bluetooth device's user's manual)
3. Select the Stereo headset menu on the Bluetooth device.
  - You will see a list of scanned devices.
4. Select "[Samsung]MICRO XXXXXX" from the searched list.
  - When the product is connected to the Bluetooth device, the Product will display "CONNECT" on the front display, followed by the device name of the connected Bluetooth device.
5. Play music on the connected device.
  - You can listen to the music playing on the connected Bluetooth device over the Product.

- In Bluetooth mode, some model's Repeat/Stop/Next/Back functions are not available.

### NOTE

- The Product only supports Middle Quality SBC data(up to 237kbps@48kHz), and does not support High Quality SBC data(328kbps@44.1kHz).
- Only one Bluetooth device can be paired at a time.
- Search or connection by product may not be performed properly in the following cases:
  - If there emits a strong electric wave around product.
  - If several Bluetooth devices are simultaneously paired with product.
  - If the Bluetooth device is turned off, not in place, or malfunctions.
  - Note that such devices as microwave oven, wireless LAN adapter, plasma bulb and gas stove use the same frequency range as the Bluetooth device, which can cause an electric interference.

### To disconnect the Bluetooth device from the Product

You can disconnect the Product from the Bluetooth device. (Refer to Bluetooth device's user's manual)

- The Product will be disconnected.
- When the Product is disconnected from the Bluetooth device, the Product will display "DIS CON" on the front display.

### To disconnect the Product from the Bluetooth device

Press the **F** button on the top panel to switch from "BT/GAL" to another mode.

- Except disconnect through function conversion, the connected Bluetooth device will wait a certain time for response from the product before terminating the connection. (Disconnection time may differ, depending on the Bluetooth device)
- The currently connected device will be disconnected.

### NOTE

- In Bluetooth connection mode, the Bluetooth connection will be lost if the distance between the Product and the Bluetooth device exceeds the limit (10 meters). If the distance decreases to the effective range or you restart the Bluetooth device, the Bluetooth connection can be restored.
- If the Bluetooth device falls back in the effective range, you can restart to restore the pairing with the Bluetooth device.
- With some Bluetooth devices, some functions may not work properly.

## Using the product with Samsung GALAXY device


1. Push the top panel manually first.
2. Press the **Galaxy** button under the top panel ,the top panel pops open automatically,then you can see the Galaxy Dock.
3. Place the Galaxy device in the Galaxy Dock.
  - The Galaxy device charging automatically.

### <Samsung Galaxy Devices>

To use your Samsung Galaxy series device with the Dual Dock, you must download and install the Docking Mode application from the Android Market on the device. To download, follow these steps:

1. Tap the Play Store (Android Market) icon on the Samsung Galaxy device's main screen.
2. Tap the search icon on the screen to access the search bar.
3. In the search bar, type in the [Samsung Wireless Audio with Dock], and then search.
4. In the search result list, find, and then tap [Samsung Wireless Audio with Dock] to start downloading.
5. Tap [install].

To play music, follow these steps:

- 1-1. If you start the app when the product is the only device for the Bluetooth connection,selecting PLAY in your device automatically establishes the Bluetooth connection to the product and the unit plays music.
- 1-2. If there are multiple devices for Bluetooth connection including the product,
  - 1) When you start the app, the list of the devices which you can connect to the product will appear.
  - 2) Play music after connecting to the product by selecting it on the list of devices.
    - If there exists a Bluetooth device paired to the product before, it will not appear in the list and be connected automatically.
2. If you replace the product which you have paired to your mobile device, you should delete the remaining settings saved in your device before pairing to the new one.
  - Tap  → Tap <Clear data>.
  - The operation of the "Samsung Wireless Audio with Dock "may be different depending on application's version.



#### NOTE

- Once you started the application, running is not disturbed by charging your mobile device with an ordinary charger.
- When you connect other device to the product after

connecting Samsung Galaxy device in docking mode, you may have to turn off the Bluetooth mode of the Samsung Galaxy device.

- If you have trouble with connecting the Samsung Galaxy device to the Dual Dock, turn off the device's Bluetooth mode.
- Some Samsung Galaxy device may not fit into this product's Galaxy Dock. In such cases, connect such Galaxy device with USB cable to the USB port for charging it.(Please do not connect a device via USB to the product while in AUX, FM or CD mode. Otherwise, it may cause an error.)
- If your Galaxy device is in Bluetooth mode and docked onto this product, do not touch on the Galaxy device's touch screen with your body. (suggested to use remote control for operation)
- Compatibility is subject to carrier and regional specifications.
- Downloading the "Samsung Wireless Audio with Dock" application is required,if you haven't downloaded this application on your device,and used only for charging the Galaxy device.
- Some Galaxy devices docked on Galaxy Dock may experience unstable connection. If such a device is exposed to shock, the connection will be broken.

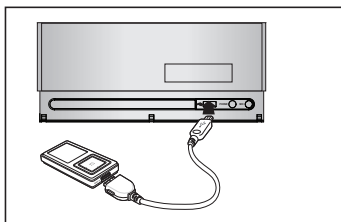

## USB Function

### Playing Media Files using the USB Host Feature

You can enjoy media files such as pictures, movies and music saved on an MP3 player, USB memory stick or digital camera in high quality video with 2.0 channel sound by connecting the storage device to the USB port of the product.



1. Connect the external USB storage device to the USB jack of the main unit.
2. Select the USB mode by pressing the **F( )** button on the main unit.
  - You can select USB by pressing the **FUNCTION** button on the remote control.
3. Press the **▲▼◀▶** buttons to select **Videos**, **Music** or **Photo**.
  - Select a file to play.

### Safe USB Removal

To prevent damage to the memory stored in the USB device, perform safe removal before disconnecting the USB cable.

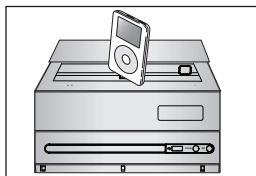
- Press the **YELLOW(C)** button.
  - **REMOVE** will appear on the display.
- Remove the USB cable.

#### NOTE

- Remove the USB cable from the USB port slowly. Otherwise, it may cause damage to the USB port.

## Using an iPod/iPhone

If the system is connected to iPod/iPhone, You can play music and video in iPod/iPhone using the system.

## Recording Function



You can record sound of the CD, the Radio Broadcasting or sound from the external source into the USB storage device.

1. Switch the system on by pressing the **Power** button.
2. Connect the external USB storage device you want to record to the USB jack ( ) of the main unit
3. Play a Disc, tune to a station or connect the external source to the main unit.

### CD

- Press the **F** button on the main unit to select the DVD/CD function.
- Press the **OPEN/CLOSE** button to open the Disc Compartment.
- Insert a CD and press the **OPEN/CLOSE** button to close the Disc Compartment.
- Use the CD selection ( or ) button to select the desired song.

### Tuner

- Press the **F** button on the main unit to select FM.
- Tune to a station you want to record.

### External Source

- Connect an External Component/MP3 player to the main unit.
- Press the **F** button to select the AUX input.
- Play a song from the external device.

4. Press the **USB REC** button to start recording.

### CD

- "TRACK RECORDING" is displayed and CD recording starts.
- Press and hold the **USB REC** button to start recording the all tracks of the Disc.

USB REC



"FULL CD RECORDING" is displayed.

- If you play the MP3/WMA file, the file is copied into the USB device totally.
- To copy a folder, highlight desired folder first and press USB REC button, the folder is copied.

"COPY XX"→"COPY END" is displayed. When the recording is done, "STOP" will be displayed.

- If there is duplicating file name, "FILE EXISTED" is displayed, and the function is canceled.

### Tuner/External Source

- "RECORDING" is displayed.

5. To stop recording, press the **STOP** ( ) button and it automatically creates and saves recorded files in .MP3 format.

- After the recording, a directory named "RECORDING"(CD), "CD COPY"(MP3 CD), "TUNER RECORDING" or "AUX RECORDING" will be created in your device.

### NOTE

- Do not disconnect the USB or the AC Cord during the recording as this may cause damage to the file..
- If you disconnected USB device during a recording, the main unit will be powered off and you may not delete the recorded file. In this case, please connect the USB device to the PC and backup the USB data on the PC first and then format the USB device.
- When the USB memory has insufficient free space, it will display "NOT ENOUGH MEMORY".
- The recording works if the USB device or the HDD is formatted in the FAT file system. (The NTFS file system is not supported.)
- When you use CD high speed search function, the CD recording doesn't work.
- Sometimes, the recording time may be longer with some USB devices.
- The equalizer is set to "OFF" automatically and becomes not available during a CD recording.
- The REPEAT function is set to "OFF" automatically and becomes not available during a CD recording.
- If you use the MIC function during the CD recording, the voice from the microphone will be recorded.
- You can not record the radio when searching or no available station is found in the Tuner mode.
- Note that setting the input level too loud when recording music from an external device through the AUX and USB channel may cause noise into the recording. In that case, lower the external device's volume level.
- Up to 300MB of a video file can be recorded.

## Recording Speed

You can select the recording speed before recording.

1. Each time you press the **CD REC SPEED** button on the remote control, the recording speed will change as following:

- While the Tuner or External Source is recording, the recording speed does not supported.
- When you select RECORD SPD x 3, the audio sound will not be output.
